

Scoring in Darts

SCORING: on a dartboard you can score **singles**, **doubles** and **triples**.

The thin outer ring is worth **double** the number and the thin inner ring is worth **triple** the number. Everything else is worth **single** points.

The only exception is the **inner** and **outer bullseye** in the middle of the board. The outer bull is worth **25 points**, and the inner bull is worth **50 points**.

BULLSEYE (50 POINTS)



OUTER BULLSEYE (25 POINTS)

For Example, If your dart lands in the **11 section** you score **11 points**.

If it lands in the **outer ring (double)** of the **11 section**, you score **22 points**
- *because $11 \times 2 = 22$*

If it lands in the **inner ring** of the **11 section** you score **33 points**
- *because $11 \times 3 = 33$*
